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MERCE CUNNINGHAM CENTENNIAL SUMMARY REPORT

Overview

From September 2018 to December 2019, the world celebrated the Centennial of visionary American choreographer and artist Merce Cunningham. During this time, some 140,000 people took part in more than 600 unique public events celebrating Cunningham and his creative genius. There were Centennial activities on every continent except Antarctica

For this celebration, the Merce Cunningham Trust (the "Trust") pursued several strategic goals in its programming and allocation of resources:

- Presenting as much of Cunningham's work as possible to the broadest and most diverse audience
- Making it possible for anyone who wanted to participate in the celebration to do so in the way *they* wanted to
- Demonstrating that Cunningham's work is accessible and can be performed and appreciated by everyone
- Laying a foundation for new talent to experience Cunningham and signaling an openness to that talent in the future
- Reaching the public in ways and in places the Trust is not ordinarily able to

While many Centennial programs addressed multiple goals, others targeted a specific aspiration. With the exception of the one-night only *Night of 100 Solos: A Centennial Event*, the Trust's approach was to listen to potential partners and then responsively design a program meeting each partner's needs or desires. As a result, with Trust support and the generous support of a select group of funders, there were performances, convenings, publications, film screenings, master classes, workshops, lecture demonstrations, exhibitions, and much more.

During the celebration:

• Thirty-one different Cunningham repertory works were performed by professional and educational institutions in close to 300 performances

- Close to 200 film screenings of his life and work were held
- One new performance film and two new documentary films were released
- Some 100 workshops and master classes were held for the public
- Six new or reissued publications were released or scheduled for release
- More than twenty convenings were held on aspects of Cunningham's work and life
- More than fifteen exhibitions touched on his work and life

In order to support the celebration and accomplish its goals, the Trustees committed to leveraging Trust assets in the most efficacious manner. Knowing that they wanted to make the biggest statement possible for this one-time opportunity, they agreed to enlarged budgets and operations. Working with a pre-approved Centennial budget beginning in 2017 that included expanded regular operations, the Trust executive director managed the programs' implementation, enjoying the latitude to determine the specific activities and programs supported or undertaken. Total spending from the initial Centennial planning activity (January 2017) through the end of the celebration (December 2019) was \$4.5 million. This was a \$1.65 million greater expenditure over this period than "regular" Trust operations would have spent. Market returns, which supply a large portion of Trust cash flow were very positive during this period, helping the Trust maintain its asset base despite the increased expenses.

The breadth and success of the Centennial efforts can be seen in the statistics and press coverage included in this report, which document much of the activity. While it is premature to see all of the results and impacts of the Centennial, it is clear that ten years after his death, the world still responds positively and is interested in the work and creativity of Merce Cunningham. In addition, as a result of Centennial activities, there is now "proof" that a new generation of practicing artists and the public find great value in the legacy Cunningham left behind. Moving forward, the Trust is committed to further supporting these trends and continuing to pursue its strategic imperatives to maintain the Cunningham legacy, further its relevance, and transmit its value to the public and the field of dance in the future.

Repertory Licensing

Perhaps the centerpiece of any dance centennial celebration is the amount of repertory performed before the public. In this regard, the Cunningham Centennial must be viewed as a huge success.

Working tirelessly with partners around the world, the Trust's director of licensing, Patricia Lent, successfully licensed thirty-one repertory works (not to mention *Events* and *MinEvents*) during the Centennial period. Included in this group are works from almost every period of Cunningham's seven-decades long career.

Companies large and small performed the works, including New York Theater Ballet, Centre National de la Danse Contemporaine/Angers, the Stephen Petronio Company, Ballet de Lorraine, New York City Ballet, Lyon Opera Ballet, Paris Opera Ballet, and many others. More than 100,000 people enjoyed Cunningham dances in almost 300 performances during the Centennial. On average, there were almost twenty performances each month of the fifteen month celebration.

Overall, approximately twenty-five dance companies performed Cunningham repertory during the Centennial. If we also consider *Events*, *MinEvents*, and *Solos*, the number grows to almost fifty dance organizations performing Cunningham. Demonstrating the Trust's commitment to sharing the work with as broad an audience as possible, performances of Cunningham work were also presented by almost twenty institutions of higher learning dance programs. These helped achieve one of the Trust's strategic commitments and had a deep impact in sharing the work and legacy with the next generation of dancers.

The greatest concentrations of performances were in April 2019 and in the fall of 2019. The first of these intensive periods was the month of Cunningham's one hundredth birthday and the other was a result of Paris' Festival d'Automne's programming focus on Merce Cunningham. Considering it a major demonstration of the historical support France showed him during his lifetime, the Festival presented almost ninety performances of Cunningham work during the fall and included companies from throughout Europe. This was the greatest concentration of Cunningham dancing during the Centennial, surpassing New York where there were sixty-three performances. More

than 39,000 people attended live Cunningham Centennial performances in France, again surpassing New York's performance attendance, which was some 25,000.

This level of collaboration made it possible for the public to experience a very broad amount of Cunningham repertory and work. Many iconic works, such as *Summerspace*, *RainForest*, *BIPED*, *Scenario*, *Winterbranch*, and *Exchange* were revived or reconstructed for the Centennial. Additionally, other works, such as *Story*, *Totem Ancestor*, *Crises*, *and Cross Currents*, rarely seen even in the later years of the Merce Cunningham Dance Company, were performed during this period. This was only possible with the commitment and interest of a number of companies devoted to Cunningham's work.

Night of 100 Solos: A Centennial Event

Of the more than 650 artists who participated in the Centennial, some 100 from Europe and North America were involved in *Night of 100 Solos: A Centennial Event* ("*N100S*") This one-night only international Cunningham *Event*, was a special celebration on what would have been Merce Cunningham's 100 birthday (April 16, 2019). Modeled after *Cunningham Events*, which Cunningham originally created so he could perform his work in non-traditional performance spaces, each performance featured 100 solos drawn from the entirety of his seven-decade long career.

Three cities that were important to Cunningham during his life were the site of this special birthday *Event*: New York, London, and Los Angeles. Co-produced with the Brooklyn Academy of Music (New York), the Barbican London, and the University of California Los Angeles' Center for the Art of Performance, the Trust mounted a ninety-minute performance in each city. All three performances were live-streamed through the Trust and its co-producing partners' websites, on Facebook, and through the new public broadcasting digital platform *All Arts*.

N100S was the largest undertaking of the Centennial and was the only activity truly produced by the Trust during the celebration. The entire program and its execution was overseen by centennial producer Trevor Carlson and subsequently won a Bessie award for best performance in 2019. The selection and oversight of the staging in each city was carefully curated by authorized Cunningham stagers Patricia Lent (NYC), Daniel Squire (London), and Andrea Weber (Los Angeles), along with assistants Jean Freebury (NYC), Ashley Chen and Cheryl Therrien (London), and Dylan Crossman (Los Angeles). The Event and its ancillary activities were funded by the Trust and its presenting partners with additional major support from the Howard Gilman Foundation.

The performances, featuring a diverse selection of twenty-five dancers in each city, demonstrated the relevance and ongoing life of Merce Cunningham's legacy and work. None of the dancers who performed in *N100S* had any previous direct experience with Cunningham or his work. In addition to the dancers, each city had a curated group of local composers who created original music under the leadership of a former member of the Cunningham Music Committee (John King, Christian Wolff, and Stephen Moore). Each performance also featured commissioned digital scenery from major contemporary

artists Pat Stier (BAM), Richard Hamilton (London), and Jennifer Steinkamp (Los Angeles).

In total, ninety-six artists participated in the performances and an additional forty-two former Merce Cunningham Dance Company ("MCDC") members also helped prepare the dancers and solos for the stage. In addition to transmitting Cunningham work to a new generation of dancers, the program engaged more than half of the total cohort of former Cunningham dancers, as the Trust opened its arms to as broad and diverse a set of stakeholders as possible. Much of this preparatory work was captured digitally for future reference and will be available through the Trust's archives.

Across the three performances, some 6000 people were able to see the live performance, with an additional several hundred attending the dress rehearsals in each city. The evening's live-streams, which remain available for public viewing, have drawn more than 11,000 people to view the performances online. Some of those who streamed the *Event* live were catering to hundreds of viewers in private parties or groups organized by institutions such as REDIV (the Ibero-American Dance Film Festival).

From the Trust's point of view, N100S was a strategic success that accomplished its goals:

- Organizing a large public opportunity to celebrate Merce Cunningham's Centennial
- Bringing the performance to people around the world, rather than forcing them to come to it
- Including a large group of stakeholders
- Engaging former Cunningham dancers and musicians as participants in the evening
- Demonstrating that Cunningham Technique and repertory can be danced at a professional level by people who never were exposed to it or worked with Cunningham
- Making clear that the legacy is pushing into the future

In what should prove to have a profound long-lasting impact in passing the work to a new generation, the Trust offered each of the evening's performers a two-year free license to

perform the solos they danced. The result, which is evident already, is that Cunningham's work is now spreading widely to places it never would have gotten despite the absence of a Cunningham company. The Trust, following the shift in the dance ecology away from concert dance companies, is using individual dancers to show and disseminate the work instead of being limited to the traditional pathway of using companies.

N100S continues to have an impact, generating interest and further exposure long after the evening has passed because of the availability of the performance streams and these unique dancer licenses. Some of the activities that have flowed from the evening include public showings of the performance streams at the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth in three galleries and performances of solos in places such as Akron, Cleveland, Australia, Japan, France, and around the United States.

There is little doubt that *N100S* demonstrated that the Cunningham legacy is alive, vibrant, and relevant - all of which are core to the success of the Trust's mission. Looking to the future, maintaining the work's integrity will be helped by the coaching and staging material captured during preparations for the evening. At the same time, the Trust continues to encourage those dancers who performed in *N100S*, as well as others, to appreciate that there are ways for them to engage with the Cunningham work and legacy on their own.

Centennial Community Programming

Another large Centennial effort was to reach into communities where the legacy does not often go. Unlike other legacies, such as those of Graham, Balanchine, or Limon, Cunningham's company closed after his death, as he wished. Without such a company, there are fewer opportunities to reach the public. To address this, the Trust planned a focused Centennial effort relying on non-performance activities that included aspects of his legacy.

With the generous support of the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation, this Community Programs effort developed bespoke programming in conjunction with local partners. This program was a huge success and allowed the Trust to reach into communities where it had not yet been. Activities took place in twenty countries, ranging from Argentina to Estonia to Malawi to New Zealand, and of course, in the United States. Overall, there were eighty-four different programs in the effort, thirty-eight of which took place in the United States. From reports, more than 4000 people participated in the programs, joining film screenings (sometimes with discussions involving the artists), lecture demonstrations, workshops of different types (technology, chance operations, technique), panel discussions, and showings of artistic work.

The flexibility the programs offered, including bringing experts in all aspects of Cunningham's creative output-his writings, his processes, his collaborations, his aesthetics, and his philosophies of art and life--were at the heart of the program's attraction and success. Sending a teacher into African schools to introduce and cross pollinate Cunningham with local movement techniques, having Cunningham experts work with a social services organization in delivering its wraparound youth services, and sharing Cunningham creative processes with local artists commissioned to create their own work are just a few of the opportunities the Community Programs offered.

A major effort of the Community Programs was a partnership with the Ibero-American Film Festival network--REDIV. Through this collaboration, the Trust provided five curated film packages for presentation at any one of the more than thirty festivals in this network. In addition, the Trust sent a workshop leader to conduct panels and workshops locally to a significant number of sites. Some of these venues also engaged a local Cunningham Technique teacher to lead a Cunningham Technique class for professional

and amateur dancers. Finally, the Trust supported the publication of a special festival guide in Spanish, which offered context and academic material on MC and his work.²

One of the most impactful results of the Doris Duke funding was the ability for the Trust to maximize and leverage its lean staff and resources beyond what would have been possible without the generous grant. With this added support, Centennial producer Trevor Carlson was able to make himself available to places far and wide, bringing his unique, diverse experience and expertise to many of the Community Programs. Similarly, Trust director of licensing Patricia Lent could work with local groups, using her knowledge to open the often hidden riddles of Cunningham to people who previously had no exposure to Merce Cunningham or even to dance. Former dancers Rashaun Mitchell and Silas Riener brought special skill to the intersection of Merce Cunningham's processes with practicing artists' creativity. Local artists exited these programs, as they did in Mr. Carlson's workshops, with concrete tools they could continue to use as they explore their own work and voice.

In addition, the Community Programs afforded the Trust the opportunity to deliver programs that using individuals who had not been Merce Cunningham Dance Company members nor former employees of the Merce Cunningham Foundation. In this way, the Community Programs furthered another critical Trust goal of laying a foundation for the future when those who had direct contact with Merce Cunningham are no longer available. The funding that made such a rich and diverse set of programs possible, also made it possible to explore these additional human resources in delivering the material, which relies on personal interaction to effectively pass it on.

Stepping back, it is easy to see how the Community Programs fit within the parameters of the Trust's work and specifically its intentions for the Centennial. Overall, the Trust pursues activities that perform or present Merce Cunningham's work, that ensure or build an audience for his work, that ensure or build necessary resources to share or present his work, or that foster some new/current creativity connected to Cunningham's work. There is little doubt that the Community Programs built audiences and fostered new work connected to his work. Throughout the Centennial, the feedback and response of local audiences to the non-performance activities of the Community Programs was positive, showing a real local enthusiasm for the experience.

Finally, the nature and design of this specific program afforded the Trust the leeway to experiment and offer its collaboration in new ways. As a result, we can see that these non-performance interactions have great value in sharing the legacy of Merce Cunningham and reaching people in multiple ways. One result of this effort is that the Trust will continue to explore and use these kinds of programs in the future, furthering our mission of preserving and spreading the legacy of Merce Cunningham.

Screenings

Throughout his life, Merce Cunningham expressed great interest in and experimented with film and other means of recording his work and creating new work. In fact, he calls this one of the four great discoveries in his life and artistry. It is fitting, therefore, that the Centennial offered many opportunities to screen films Cunningham made or that were made about him and his work. In addition, filmmakers made two new films about Cunningham that were released during the Centennial period. These were the first new films about him and his work since his death in 2009.

While there were many Centennial partnerships and activities that included film and/or screenings, two of them were of major significance and impact. Introduced in the fall of 2018 and running in spring 2019, New York's Anthology Film Archives offered a weekly screening of Cunningham films or films about Cunningham. These screenings, often in conjunction with a panel that might include former Cunningham dancers or collaborators, explored the diversity of Cunningham's engagement with film and digital media across several decades. Anthology curator Jed Rapfogel worked closely with Electronic Arts Intermix executive director Rebecca Kleman to curate the Monday night series. With Anthology's commitment to showing archival film prints whenever possible, most of the works shot on film were projected from an original print that was generously supplied by the Jerome Robbins Dance Division of the New York Public Library.

The other large film program, which had international reach and helped the Trust penetrate into parts of Europe and South America, was a partnership with REDIV, a network of Ibero-American film festivals. This consortium, which counts more than thirty local film festivals in its membership, partnered with the Merce Cunningham Trust to offer turn-key festival programming. In addition, the Trust supported dubbing Spanish subtitles to a number of works, as well as the creation and publication of a special Festival book offering Cunningham writings and articles about him. At many of the festivals, the Trust also supported a guest lecturer, workshop leader, or teacher to offer additional contextual and practical interaction with the Cunningham legacy. These included master classes in Cunningham Technique, chance procedure workshops, DanceForms workshops, panel discussions, and more.³

The REDIV website describes their program thus:

The project «The key figure of screendance» is being presented in different formats: film, documentary, publishing and performance. The project can be seen at all the 24 associated festivals and also at FIVideodanza CDMX México, MUMVI México, Cuerpo Digital Bolivia and Spain's VII Festival Fiver, which partners with the new BAC Madrid #0 (Bienal de las Artes del Cuerpo, Imagen y Movimiento de Madrid). This project has also been exhibited at the Agite y Sirva Festival, in Mexico, and at Crear en Libertad, in Paraguay.

Two other film projects that the Merce Cunningham Trust supported were the documentary *If the Dancer Dances*, by Maia Wechsler and former MCDC dancer Lise Friedman, and *Cunningham*, by filmmaker Alla Kovgan. While the Trust was not a producer of either of these, it fully supported the projects by making the legacy and the rights to Cunningham material available to the filmmakers.

The films, though very different in approach, when taken together offer audiences, particularly those not familiar with Cunningham and his work, valuable insight into the man and his work. *If the Dancer Dances* tells the story of the complex process of restaging a work from a past master who is no longer with us. *Cunningham* explores the genesis and early period of the master's work, recreating excerpts from a number of his iconic pieces with former dancers of his company in newly considered environments.

Cunningham exists in 2D and 3D, offering very different experiences of the material and work. The 3D version allows audiences to appreciate Cunningham's artistry in a more visceral way than the traditional film-going experience. The research leading up to the making of this film also resulted in many new additions to the Cunningham archives and brought forward many new areas of research for scholars and critics.

All told, including the above described programs, there were almost 200 screenings as part of the Cunningham Centennial. Audiences from New Zealand to Chile to Moscow and beyond enjoyed seeing and learning about Cunningham and his legacy through the media of film and video.

Centennial Media Efforts

One of the Trust's central Centennial efforts was to leverage the celebration to expand the audience for Merce Cunningham and his work. At the same time, in response to requests for contextual material on Cunningham and his works, the Trust sought to develop digital materials addressing these needs. Pursuing a strategy that integrated how it responded to these two imperatives, the Trust implemented a plan generating new pieces that included brief narrative content designed to be evergreen, relevant, and accessible to all.

Two initial principles were central to this digital effort:

- A dedicated person who understood the digital milieu **and** was well-versed in the world of Cunningham and dance generally was needed
- Instagram, like dance, is a platform relying on visual communication and was, therefore, ripe for the Trust to exploit during the Centennial

This entire effort--building an online younger audience and creating unique engaging content--was entrusted to a director of media, hired especially for the Centennial period to create a bridge to these audiences. To succeed, there was little doubt that this project depended on finding the right person to oversee its design and implementation.

Working with the staff, the Trust identified and engaged Daniel Madoff, a former MCDC dancer who began a career as a videographer and a lighting designer after retiring from dancing with the company. His intimate knowledge of the repertory and his sensibility towards building an online audience were the ideal combination to carry this effort forward. Tasked with both the creation of digital support materials during the Centennial and building an Instagram presence, he took the lead and delivered at a very high level.

Daniel began with an intensive investigation of Trust assets, identifying those materials that would be helpful either for the contextual support materials or for engaging people on Instagram in an accessible way. His goal was to create inviting and informative content for those who had no previous contact with Merce Cunningham, as well as for those already familiar with Cunningham or his work. Over the course of the Centennial, he created unique daily content providing engaging information for specific events and/or performances or to the Cunningham legacy in general.

While he was creating this content, the Trust director of licensing was also creating daily historical content looking back at MCDC activities in homage to long-term Cunningham archivist David Vaughan. These daily items--*On This Day*--were designed to be easily sharable on Instagram, Twitter, Facebook and the Trust website. With the end of the Centennial, they continue to have a life on the Trust website as part of the historical record of Cunningham and his legacy.

In its initial planning, the Trust allocated resources mainly to the creation of images and materials directly related to licensed repertory. The Trust planned to repurpose this content created for licensees and deliver it (or versions of it) to the broader public at large. This material was thus made available to the Trust social media platforms and websites. The Trust assumed that licensees would welcome such materials and use it in their marketing. While extremely successful at building an audience and spreading the word about Cunningham and his work to the public, licensees were unenthusiastic about using the Trust-created materials because they did not feature licensee performers in the works. Rather than show other companies or even Cunningham performing works or speaking about the work, most opted to go without these support materials, which was an unexpected conclusion.

Despite this, the content continues to be extremely valuable in other venues, such as in the Trust Dance Capsules and as engaging content for Trust social media platforms, allowing the Trust to reap a return on its investment in these digital support materials. Post-Centennial, they continue to live in the Trust's archives and serve as evergreen research and resource materials of the legacy.

In addition to these efforts, Trust Scholar-in-Residence, Nancy Dalva, continued to populate the Trust Facebook page and her reconfigured Centennial blog during the entire Celebration. As a final digital effort in sharing the legacy with the public, she also reconfigured the Trust YouTube site into easily digestible playlists, and offered some dozen new interviews, performances, and outtakes from the hugely successful *Mondays with Merce* webcasts.

Evidence of the success of these efforts and the Centennial's expanded footprint and reach are demonstrated by the more than 1.5 million views of our Instagram channel and the 50,000 likes and followers on the Trust's Facebook page.

Cage and Cunningham

Throughout their lives, John Cage and Merce Cunningham were the closest of collaborators. Continuing in this tradition, there is close contact between the Cage and Cunningham Trusts that was advantageously maintained during the Centennial.

Initial Centennial planning included programs such as *Music for Merce*, which focused on Cage's music with Cunningham and *Cage Cunningham Dinners*, which were based in Cage's long history as a mycologist. As is true with most of the Centennial efforts, the Trust worked with partners to build the best program for their interests and needs and did not pre-determine its programming. In this particular area, the John Cage Trust, led by its director Laura Kuhn, played a very active role in fostering Cage specific programs as part of the Cunningham celebration.

During the Centennial, two *Musicircuses* were staged under the organization of the John Cage Trust.⁴ Both of these integrated Cunningham dancing into the format, which features many performers whose live performances rely on chance procedures in determining the performance schedule of the participants. The material they then perform is specifically up to them. These two events took place at Bard College, featuring Cunningham Centennial Solos and at the Centre National de la Danse in Paris in conjunction with the Festival d'Automne.

In addition to these performances, the Cage Trust, with support from the Cunningham Trust, worked with English researcher Victoria Miguel to stage a version of Cage's multifaceted *Mewantemooseicday*.⁵ Partnering with the Glasgow School of Art and Glasgow Clyde College, the program included film screenings, performances of dance, and performances of live music. Consistent with Cage's original blueprint, partner organizations offered their students workshops and classes in Cage and Cunningham aesthetics and material. Culminating in a full day of activity, the program included guest

speakers and took place in venues around Glasgow. Those interested, were also able to participate in mushroom forays, following on Cage's well-known practice.

In addition to these programs, there were plenty of other instances during the Centennial that incorporated Cage music: live piano accompaniment to Cunningham choreography; collaboration between university music and dance departments in mounting Centennial programming; and live accompaniment with film screenings of Cunningham work are just a few examples.

A number of Centennial celebrants embraced the idea of Cage-Cunningham dinners. For example, the John Cage Trust offered a dinner built around Cage recipes on the night of the Centennial, which also afforded participants the opportunity to view the evening's *Night of 100 Solos: A Centennial Event* together. Leading up to that evening, the Center for the Art of Performance at UCLA, hosted a patron dinner built around this idea that also incorporated chance procedures.

The close and deep connection between Cage and Cunningham is well known and documented. It is, of course, fitting that there should be close collaboration between the two legacies in a Cunningham celebration. In addition to the programs described above, the sheer number of Cunningham dances that incorporate Cage music or conceptual ideas and the publication and reissuance of publications by and about the two artists further exemplify this transformative and influential 20th century partnership.⁶

In Conversation with Merce

One of the Trust's strategic goals is to share Merce Cunningham's legacy with practicing artists in a way that they find useful in their practice. During the Centennial, this goal was pursued in chance procedure and DanceForms workshops, which introduced processes Cunningham used in his creative work. In these workshops, artists from diverse backgrounds explored these ways of working and had the opportunity to use them in creating their own work.

Looking to go further, the Trust also initiated a program exposing practicing artists to a deeper interaction with Cunningham's work and processes while also providing a fuller opportunity to use this experience in their own creativity. Structured in two parts and in partnership with local organizations, *In Conversation With Merce* offered extended interaction with Cunningham's legacy that was coupled with a commission to create new work in response to the experience.

More specifically, groups of local artists, chosen by a local partner, spent an intensive workshop period learning, deconstructing, and performing Cunningham repertory under the leadership of Trust authorized stagers. The artists were then charged and commissioned to create new work in media of their choice for public performance or exhibition. The new creations were scheduled in a performance/exhibition before the public alongside the Cunningham repertory that provided the initial foundation for the new work.

While the Cunningham Trust offered its assets (stagers, repertory, documentation, history, etc.), the work created remained solely the property of the artists creating it who had no future obligation to the Trust. During the Centennial period, this program had three incarnations, each of which was tailored to the specific desires and characteristics of the local partner and community, who were the driving force in each program's design and implementation. The Trust's only requirement was that there had to be a public performance of the new work that also showed the underlying Cunningham source material. Each program also needed a debrief at its conclusion so that the Trust could learn from the experience and continue to adjust in order to offer the most valuable program possible to promote the legacy as a relevant creative process tool in today's creative culture.

The three partners who joined the Trust in this program were: Velocity Dance Center (Seattle), Skirball Center for the Arts at NYU (New York City), and Hope Mohr's Bridge Project collaborating with SFMoMA's Open Space and ODC Theater (San Francisco). Each of these programs was directed for the Trust by former dancers Rashaun Mitchell (also a Trustee) and Silas Riener, both of whom, had already been doing work in this area.

The first of these programs, at Velocity, chose the artists to be involved from an open call to the community, which resulted in a one-day showing of a multitude of work at its conclusion. Skirball chose to commission three (3) New York artists who had little in common, but all had some experience or connection to Merce Cunningham. The San Francisco consortium chose ten local artists who are committed to using their art for social justice with the intention of pushing the conversation around legacy into the heart of this developing thread of practice. This program also had a strong online component that leveraged SFMoMA's audience and online museum space and expanded this version of the program into additional aesthetic conversations.

Publications

The Centennial presented the opportunity, ten years after Cunningham's death, for revisiting previous publications and expanding the available work on his life and career. During the Centennial period, there were six Cunningham related publications issued with a seventh that had been planned for Centennial publication released in January 2020, just after the official end of the celebration. These books were diverse and helped reveal different aspects of Merce Cunningham, his life, and work.

Of the seven, only one had the direct involvement of the Trust--the reissuance of Cunningham's classic *Changes: Notes on Choreography*. Originally published by Dick Higgins's Something Else Press in 1968, the book has long been out of print and hard to find. The new issuance was exactly the same content and design as the original with the exception of a new cover, different format, and special Centennial introduction cover page. A joint publication of The Song Cave and the Merce Cunningham Trust, the book was a limited edition special publication run of 2000 copies and is available for sale at specialty outlets, online, and through museums. It also serves as a special acknowledgment for Centennial partners and Trust purposes.

Another reissued publication was John Cage's *Diary: How to Improve the World (You Will Only Make Matters Worse)*, which was re-released by Siglio Press. This softbound version of the 2015 hardback version includes Parts I-VIII along with previously unpublished material from Cage's incomplete Part IX. The first eight parts were written from 1965 to 1982, and published in The Paris Review, Aspen Magazine, Clark Coolidge's Joglars, and William Copley's S.M.S. It was also published by Something Else Press as a Great Bear pamphlet by Dick Higgins and Alison Knowles (the publisher and editor of Cunningham's *Changes*), who devised the color and typographic variables upon which this Siglio edition is based. Cage worked on the incomplete and previously unpublished ninth part from 1982 to his death in 1992.

The issuance of *Diary* was timed to be published at the same time as the new publication *Love, Icebox: Letters From John Cage To Merce Cunningham*, a collection of early letters from John Cage to Merce Cunningham. The John Cage Trust published the book and it was lovingly curated by Laura Kuhn, director of the John Cage Trust and a Merce Cunningham Trust trustee. *Love, Icebox* was published on September 5, 2019, John Cage's birthday as a special gift to the Centennial celebration. The collection of letters from the early stages of Cage and Cunningham's relationship offers a very personal side

of Cage's personal and emotional state during an extremely influential period in Cunningham's development.

In 1975, James Klosty, who spent extensive time with Cunningham and his company, published his "non-dance" book *Merce Cunningham*, which was subsequently republished by Limelight in 1986. During the Centennial, James issued a gorgeous expanded edition "dance" book *Merce Cunningham Redux*, published by powerHouse Books. This new edition includes photographs of Cunningham, his dancers, and fifteen Cunningham dances. The public has never seen some of the images before. James's work continues to be one of the authoritative sources for images, many of which are iconic, of the Merce Cunningham Dance Company (then called Merce Cunningham & Dancers) from the 60s and 70s.

Another personal statement from someone close to Cunningham in his formative years as a choreographer is Marianne Preger-Simon's memoir *Dancing with Merce Cunningham*. Spending a year in Paris (1948-49) while in college, Preger-Simon met Cunningham and established a life-long close relationship. She danced with him from 1950-1958, being a founding member of his company, which began at Black Mountain College in 1953. Her upbeat loving story adds another personal picture of the man who went on to challenge so many ideas about movement and art in the late twentieth century. Preger-Simon's book pays great tribute to this influence, as well as the personal impact he had on her, including the final meeting between them on Cunningham's ninetieth birthday.

Personal stories were not the only type of publications during the Centennial. Carrie Noland, a French and performing arts scholar has been researching Cunningham and his work for many years. Revisiting, ten years after his death, some of the assumptions scholars and critics have made about Cunningham and his work, Noland's *Merce Cunningham: After the Arbitrary*, takes a deep look at Cunningham's process, his roots, and some of the influences on him. Originally scheduled to be released during the Centennial, it saw the light of day in January, just after the Centennial officially concluded. While too soon to gauge its impact, *After the Arbitrary* is likely to engender a new round of thought and conversation around Cunningham, his work, and his process.

Trust scholar-in-residence Nancy Dalva was the guest curator for an edition of *Dance Index* dedicated to Merce Cunningham and his Centennial. Drawing on her archive of personal conversations with Cunningham, the issue is designed as an extended interview

session, revealing elements of different aspects of his work and aesthetics. Coupled with a collection of photographs and images, this handsome publication joins the select collection of Eakins Press *Dance Index* publications including those devoted to Jerome Robbins, Lincoln Kirstein, and other dance luminaries and subjects.


In addition to these general publications during the Centennial, the Trust partnered with REDIV to create companion publication for the five curated film programs available to that network. Published in Spanish, *Merce Cunningham Centennial: Lo Elemental, Lo Impredicible, Lo Inesperado* (Merce Cunningham Centennial: The Elemental, The Unpredicable, The Unexpected) provides information about each of the curated programs and a special collection of Cunningham and other writings. In addition, the book includes pictures of Cunningham and his dancers at work and dancing. The book is under consideration for an English language version in the future.





Research Fellowships

In an effort to foster ongoing scholarly research around Cunningham, like Carrie Noland's, which was previously mentioned in the Publications section of this report, the Trust has supported academic investigation of Cunningham and his work. During the Centennial period, the Trust partnered with the Center for Ballet and the Arts ("CBA") at NYU and the Jerome Robbins Dance Division of the New York Public Library ("JRDD") to offer such support.

CUNY professor Claire Bishop received a fellowship from CBA to dig more deeply into Cunningham's *Events*, unique performances comprised of excerpts, complete works, and new material that later became full dances. Bishop's research, continued with a subsequent fellowship at the JRDD, opened new avenues to considering these special performances. Originally intending to do the first real study of these as precursors to today's growing interest in museum performance and those in other non-traditional spaces, Bishop concluded that *Events* were a practical way for Cunningham to address the reality of opportunities he received to present his work. Arguing against the common perception that *Events* were "collages" of his work, she observes that they are more akin to channel surfing and were fixed and composed, not randomly thrown together.

In a major partnership on the occasion of the Centennial, the JRDD devoted its Fall 2018 cohort of six fellows to Cunningham and his legacy. The cohort presented their research in a full-day symposium devoted to Merce Cunningham in January 2019. The fellows looked at a diverse set of Cunningham-related issues or questions ranging from Cunningham's connection to classic Indian dance to studies of Cunningham as related to Zen and yoga, not to mention connections to collaborative arts related to his works. This program was intended to explore and "reveal" aspects of the JRDD's Merce Cunningham Archives, the largest and most accessed of its collections. The Fellows Program's success can be measured in that several of the fellows continue to work in the areas they began researching under this program.

Cunningham Centennial Fellows

Reid Bartelme & Harriet Jung – JRDD – *Progressing Dance Through Collaboration*Harriet Jung and Reid Bartelme are exploring the ways in which Merce Cunningham and the designers who worked with him changed an art form through inventive methods of collaboration. They are also looking at how these conversations between artists both mirrored and differed from the collaborative constructs used in Diaghilev's Ballet Russes.

Claire Bishop – CBA Cunningham Events & JRDD – Pragmatic Expediency: A History of Cunningham Events

The recent proliferation of contemporary dance in art museums has led to polarizing debates about the intersection of visual art and dance. Missing from these debates is an understanding of historical precedents, among which Museum Events, produced between 1964 and 2012, are crucial forerunners.

Robert Greskovic – JRDD - The Dancers and Their Stage Stripped Bare, More or Less, for the Dance of Merce Cunningham

Merce Cunningham's choreographic output, which dates from 1938 to the year of his death in 2009, has been keenly observed for its artful movements, "movement possibilities," Cunningham liked to call them. Costuming stands out most prominently, while, for various reasons, practical as well as aesthetic, décor is less evident. Still, both theatrical aspects variously distinguish the stages of Cunningham's dances.

Justin Tornow - JRDD - Cunningham Technique as a Practice of Freedom

Referencing both Cunningham's approach, and the myriad ways the Technique is taught, this research situates itself inside the larger framework of legacy. The goal of the research is to extract and highlight the principles found at the foundation of the Technique, and in turn to celebrate the robust scope of the practice.

Preeti Vasudevan – JRDD – Chance and Chaos

Cunningham and India at first seem like strange bedfellows, however, upon closer examination one finds the commonality between them in seeking stillness in chaos, complex isolations layered in large spacious movements, and a deep narrative within abstract choreography. This project is the study of a celebrated choreographer (Cunningham) during his two trips to India (in 1964 and later in 1985), and how India and Indian arts, especially dance, impacted his investigation of the moving body.

Netta Yerushalmy – JRDD – Merce and Netta

Netta Yerushalmy folds into one project the intimacy of archival research, the subjectivity of another dancer's dancing, the fictionalization of a relationship, and the production of fantasy through voyeurism. As a strategy to refresh and challenge her own creative instincts, Yerushalmy engages with Cunningham not as a canonical figure but rather as if he were her contemporary; maybe even her friend.

Centennial Finances

During the Centennial period, the Trust committed significant funds to celebrating the life and legacy of Merce Cunningham. While some programs can incrementally be considered Centennial programs with concomitant spending, it is difficult to really segregate Centennial activities from other operations during this period. In fact, everything the Trust did and supported was Centennial related from September 2018-December 2019.

In general, the Trust undertakes an annual spending of approximately \$900,000, which is funded from its earned income (licensing and royalties) and investment returns on its assets. During the Centennial period, spending exceeded, on a pre-approved basis, \$1 million annually. The increased spending levels were supported by Trustee approved additional uses of Trust assets and fundraising by the executive director.⁸

The Trust expenses in 2017 were \$1.08 million; in 2018 it was \$1.39 million; and in 2019 it was \$1.98 million. In total, the Trust then spent \$4.45 million during the Centennial preparation and implementation period. After factoring in its regular operating expenses of \$2.70 million for the period, the Trust spent some \$1.75 million incremental dollars during the celebration period.

This increased spending was funded by a combination of incremental allocations from the Trust's assets (\$1.2 million), donations (\$400,000), and Centennial activity earned income (\$150,000). Due to the positive returns of the market during this period and careful operational oversight, the Trust entered the Centennial planning period with \$10.6 million in assets and completed the Centennial with \$10.2 million in assets. Especially considering that the Trust waived all licensing fees during the Centennial, the Trustees consider this a very positive financial outcome.

As mentioned above, the Trust does not engage in regular fundraising, but did so during this special celebration. The response to the limited outreach the staff undertook was very

positive with a number of significant donations. Some of these were for specific programs and others were for general Centennial support.

Due to internal funding guidelines, two of the funders were unable to directly grant funds to the Trust because of its private foundation status, so they made their contributions through a fiscal sponsor. In order to facilitate this, the Trust joined Fractured Atlas, who administered these two grants, from the American Express Foundation and the Howard Gilman Foundation. All other grants, whether from individuals or from institutions were directly made to the Trust.

Looking to the Future

A major intention for the Trust during the Centennial was to look to the future and experiment with new ways and new people in sharing the legacy. This was successful in two main areas. All dancers participating in *N100S* received a two-year free license to perform their solos. The idea was to see if elements of the legacy can be shared through individual dancers, rather than having to rely on the company structure so often used in concert dance performances. In some way, the Trust was attempting to follow the field movement in which the traditional company structure is dissipating, giving way to dancers forging individual careers. So far, this effort seems very successful as many dancers continue to perform their solos and even join together to build richer presentations of this work.

In addressing another future need, the Trust used parts of the Centennial to experiment with how to pass on the information that former dancers and those who worked with Cunningham have when they are no longer available. A number of programs had carefully structured opportunities for such people to present elements of the legacy to great success. This information and experience is sure to inform preparations for future days when those with direct experience will "step off the stage." This effort is critical to the long-term future of the Trust and its mission of presenting and preserving Merce Cunningham's legacy.

Conclusion

Over the 15 months of the Centennial, the Trust partnered extensively throughout the world to offer the most exposure and engagement possible with Merce Cunningham's legacy. It was a monumental effort that required collaboration with presenters, the public, artists, and, of course, funders. While the Merce Cunningham Trust devoted significant funds to the celebration, it would not have been possible to achieve the reach it did and accomplish its goals without the generous support of its funders: Paul L. Wattis Foundation, Doris Duke Charitable Foundation, American Express Foundation, Judith Pisar, Gladys Krieble Delmas Foundation and others. There is no doubt that this funding was instrumental in the Centennial's success and the Trust is very grateful for it.

It is still too early to understand the total impact and the ramifications of the Centennial. However, what is clear is that ten years after Cunningham's death there is a great hunger for his work, which is not limited to those who previously had exposure to it. Trust Centennial programs clearly demonstrated that younger dancers, perhaps because they are trained differently and because the dance field has become less homogenous, thirst for the challenge of his work. We also saw numerous dancers, often ballet dancers who are already familiar with rigorous techniques, take to Cunningham Technique and look for ways to incorporate it into their regular training. It is also clear that institutions around the world have an appreciation for Cunningham and his legacy, were eager to participate in the Centennial, and to share the work and creativity with their audiences and publics.

Cunningham's work is reputed to be difficult and inaccessible by many. The fifteen months of the Centennial demonstrated that there is a great desire for such work, perhaps because of its very complexity and rigor. Whatever the reason, there can be little doubt that the Merce Cunningham Trust in perpetuating and actively sharing Cunningham's legacy is providing great value to the dance field and to the larger cultural landscape. The questions and fears voiced when Cunningham passed away—What will become of his work without a company? How can a legacy survive without a company and school?—have now been clearly answered by the Centennial and the partnerships it built.

Cunningham's legacy and his work is alive and relevant today, just as it was during his seven-decades long career.
